Principal's Report

Our 2022 has been a year of building and rebuilding.

The new and exciting Toolern Vale campus has been our building work. Our rebuilding work has been to rebuild and to restore our lockdown-affected students.

The students who came out of lockdown were different from those who went into lockdown. Lockdown was like those creepy abandoned mines in Victoria's goldfields. You go in with direction but come out muddled, directionless, lost. It was like they had forgotten our MCC lore, our MCC ways.

So, from the beginning of this year, we had work ahead of us: the work of rebuilding identity for our students. Little by little, throughout this year, the work of rebuilding student identity has meant they are starting to remember who they are and what it means to be an MCC student.

MCC students are valued, cared for, nurtured in their learning. Most importantly, MCC students are genuine teaching-learning partners with their teachers.

In satisfying synchronicity, this year of rebuilding has also been a year of building. Our main building work is our new campus. Apart from rainy, rainy, rainy days, the building work has been nonstop. The gym contains a full-sized basketball court. Coming off that large building is the administration centre with staff offices, reception, first-aid and other spaces. In between is a canteen for yummy lunches on special days. The classrooms are architect-designed interfacing learning spaces. There'll be a special double-sized classroom that can be used for all sorts of things; mostly visual and performing arts. There are roadways, carparks, a services shed, playgrounds, pathways and landscaped gardens, and more important than the mere buildings will be the students, staff and families.

We have enrolment waiting lists at many year levels, however in order to make it right not rushed, Toolern Vale campus is intentionally starting small. Sometimes schools start a new campus with several hundred students; but we want to build a culture of belonging right from the beginning. Everyone belongs; no one stands alone at MCC.

The new campus will open next year with around fifty lower primary students. They will be in just two classes: a Prep/Foundation class, and a Grade One class. Guiding them will be the Head of Campus, Mrs Kellie Giannes. Importantly, the staff who will be working at TV campus are people who have worked at Brookfield campus. This is crucial because we will keep one vision, the MCC vision, across our two locations. We need staff at TV who have proven they can carry our MCC way, our vibe, our feel, and our MCC ethos and culture into the new campus.

The future is bright for our students and our school. We have staff who care enough to look for ways to rebuild, restore, re-empower their Brookfield campus learners. And, we have a new campus coming to Toolern Vale, so that little by little our waiting list families can enrol their children. The Lord is blessing us, we are in His loving hands.

ENROLMENT RETENTION

Retention can be influenced by VCE subject offerings, a sense of belonging and trust, as well as the strength of VCE and VCAL programs. It is beneficial for some students to leave school to take up offers of apprenticeships or other employment opportunities that may arise during the school year. The approach of MCC is not to discourage students as is age-appropriate, to take up opportunities when it can be seen that leaving school will benefit them long-term. The average retention through senior years was 92%, MCC is very content with these 2019-22 retention results.

Melton Christian College offers both Victorian senior secondary certificates: Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL). 96% of our 2022 Year 12 students completed their certificates. The VCE class achieved a median study score of 26.

POST-SCHOOL DESTINATIONS

We are proud that an appropriate proportion of our graduates from the 2022 cohort decided to pursue apprenticeships and other work immediately after graduating from school.

We are pleased to see students seeking placements in tertiary study, or confidently entering the workforce according to their God-given gifts. Our objective is that our graduates identify their calling and make meaningful contributions to their society throughout their lives.

PARENT, STUDENT AND TEACHER SATISFACTION

A strength of Melton Christian College is the community's commitment to communicating proactively.

Parents are urged to stay in communication with College staff. Engagement, suggestions and feedback are welcomed between all segments of the College community. Students and their parents are in regular, schooling-related communication by email with school staff.

There are formal structures for communication such as Student Senate, Staff Meetings, Leadership Team meetings and College Council. In addition, the Board of Directors holds monthly meetings and the Annual General Meeting. These formal structures facilitate communication, and directly and indirectly maintain high satisfaction levels through responding effectively.

Melton Christian College participates in community surveys of parents, students, staff, alumni and other aspects of a school community. These surveys collect data for the explicit purpose of measuring school performance. The data is used directly to inform improvements to the overall work of the College and specifically learning programs and administrative systems.

Teaching Staff

STAFF ATTENDANCE

The average staff attendance for 2022 was 93%. This figure excludes planned absences for professional development, maternity, and long service leave.

WORKFORCE COMPOSITION

Melton Christian College staff members come from a wide variety of backgrounds. No staff member identifies as having an indigenous background. Our teaching staff is composed of 69% female and 28% male staff members. The percentage of our teaching staff who work full time is 64% with a further 36% part time. Of the seventy-five teaching staff, 53% have more than ten years of teaching experience.

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

All Melton Christian College teachers are accredited by The Victorian Institute of Teaching. All teachers have at the minimum, four year tertiary qualifications including Bachelor degrees. In addition eight teachers have Master's degrees, sixty-four have Bachelor degrees and eleven have Diplomas, this is because quite a lot of our staff team have multiple qualifications.

EDUCATION LEADERS COMBINED YEARS OF EXPERIENCE

The principal and the four senior leaders have a combined total of approximately 120 years of school and education leadership experience.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

All staff are given ongoing opportunities to increase their understanding, update their strategies, implement new ideas and stay abreast of curriculum change. In 2022 the expenditure for staff training and professional development was approximately \$64,000.



Curriculum, Culture, Courses and Class Communities

Melton Christian College's vision is to provide an excellent Christ-centred education that is implemented in a caring and nurturing environment, and that equips students to reach their full potential in Christ.

Our mission is as a learning community under Christ, to excel in care, nurture, welcome, and belonging. This will always continue to define our success, and to improve student learning outcomes in all realms; the whole child.

Melton Christian College staff and families hold to the following core values: Christ-centredness, Excellence, Community, Respect, and Passion for Teaching and Learning. Our College is part of the Christian Education National (CEN) network of schools. We intentionally build a school culture where positive behaviour and Christian values are uncompromisingly established. Students, staff and parents are all expected to behave according to these shared core values.

Melton Christian College provides mainstream yet diverse programs from Prep through to Year 12, and seeks to make this excellent education affordable for families. Our programs equip students to show leadership in their community. We insist on high standards of self-management, independent-thinking, respect and selflessness. Our committed Christian staff strive to provide caring, focused learning-environments for students.

Our primary program emphasises the fundamentals of numeracy and literacy. From Prep through to Year 6 we implement the Structured Literacy model, which is evidence informed best practice. We follow a systematic synthetic phonics scope and sequence. Students learn the code of reading in a specific order supported by books that match the code they are learning. 'Synthetic' means building from the smallest parts. Instruction is explicit, meaning that children are first directly taught the letters and sounds, which are then embedded in the context of meaningful words and sentences.

The College campus has a stunning gymnasium, well-equipped science and design-tech facilities enabling woodwork, and hospitality, as well as a senior-school centre for year 10-12 academic classes. Performing and Visual Arts are programs that the children enjoy greatly. The entire College community loves our annual musicals. Japanese is taught as LOTE. Onsite instrumental music lessons are available, which makes it convenient for families. Students learn about God's living world through a gardening and life-cycle program onsite. Our students

represent our school in various inter-school sporting, academic and leadership events, and we have camps throughout upper primary and secondary years. A range of VET (Vocational Education and Training) subjects are available through our partnerships with Western Edge VET Cluster of schools, however students do not need to go offsite for VET studies as the College offers onsite VET studies for our VCE and VCE-VM students. Our VCE-VM, or Vocational Major program prepares students for the workplace or post-secondary training, and the breadth of subjects offered at VCE level supports student development and prepares students for their tertiary courses.

Melton Christian College is a remarkable P-12 school community where schooling is acknowledged as the most significant partnership parents engage in, on behalf of their children. In Christian schooling our Christian faith is not merely an addition to an excellent curriculum, the Christian faith underpins every program, policy, protocol and practice. Success in Christian schooling includes nurturing children's development: academically, physically, emotionally and spiritually. Therefore, wherever possible, teachers in teams are creating programs that add value to academic learning. These value-adding programs and events will include cultural experiences, sport, performance, social development, civics and ethics, wholeness and cultural health, and many more.


