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Chairman's Report

2023 has been a year with a number of significant history making milestones. Monday 24th July 2023 was possibly the most significant day in the life of Melton Christian College since nine students first gathered in a Melton Scout Hall for the first class of Melton Christian Academy. The school registration start date was 16th July 1985.

This was the first official day of classes at the new Toolern Vale Campus of MCC. Whilst we had been hoping and praying to be able to commence onsite at the new campus for the beginning of Term 1 2023, this was not to be the case. On behalf of the College Council, Management, and staff, I want to thank the families for their patience and understanding as we navigated the delays and challenges in delivering this facility to the community. I am sure that you all agree it was worth the wait. Our architects, Cotter Reid, have designed and delivered a new, state of the art learning environment that we are so grateful to God for providing. We were able to celebrate as a community this milestone with an Official Opening Ceremony on Thursday 7th September.

Already Stage 2 at Toolern Vale is under construction. This will see further teaching spaces added to enable the organic growth of classes year by year. We are incredibly grateful to the Independent Schools Victoria Block Grant Authority for the funding support to assist the College in financing our building development.

Another first for MCC was to hold two building openings in the one calendar year. Early in Term 1, on 14th March, we celebrated the official opening of "B" Block at our Brookfield Campus, which was handed over for use late in 2022. This two level building provided new primary teaching spaces, toilet facilities, as well as admin space which is currently occupied by our ICT Team and the Uniform Shop. This building project was made possible by the generous financial assistance of the Australian Commonwealth Government. The upgrade to the College at Brookfield ensures that we continue to provide high-quality Christ-centred, education to our local communities. Several members of Parliament (both local and federal) were in attendance, and it was a good opportunity to connect with these guests, as well as the parents who attended to witness the ceremony.

During 2023, as part of our compliance responsibilities, the College has participated in a Post Enumeration Audit for our government funding requirements and a VRQA Audit & Child Safe Policy Review as part of our state school registration requirements. Both of these are important milestones to ensure the ongoing operation of MCC. The strong partnership between governance and management of your College is reflected in the smooth and successful completion of these requirements. I express my appreciation to the senior leaders and their teams for their diligence in executing these responsibilities.

As Chair of the College Council, I am especially thankful for the contribution of the other members of the Governance team and wish to recognise them for their generous and untiring efforts. We have had some changes to the team during 2023, with the return of the founder, Mr Simon Liefting to regular attendance and the recent resignation of Mr Pieter Stok after more than a 3 year term. We thank him for his contribution to MCC during this time. His wisdom and experience in Christian Education has been of real benefit to us during his journey.

New governance team members are in the process of being appointed and we are anticipating having a parent with a student at the Toolern Vale Campus and a past parent of students at Brookfield confirmed as members before 2023 concluded.

As I conclude, I affirm that the vision of providing in partnership with parents a Christ-centred education for their children remains as strong as ever. We are committed to ensuring that the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ is shared and taught. Our curriculum continues to be shaped in such a way as to acknowledge the one true God as creator of all things and that He has a good purpose for each individual whom he loves with a passion and wants them achieve the full potential that He has created within them.



Principal's Report

Have you ever chatted with any of the pioneers of Melton Christian College? It is fascinating to hear their stories about how our Brookfield campus began. They tell story after story of God surprising everyone, and throughout the hard, hard work, the moments of miracle made the seemingly impossible possible.

There's the story of starting the school before there was a school to start; our school began in a scout hall! There's the miraculous purchase of the property. There's the story of the bad boxthorn bush that blew up a ute. There's the story of the wildfire that finished off that bad, bad boxthorn bush and all of its bad boxthorn buddies. There's the story of the sewer connection and the underground rocks. There's the story of the story of the washout concrete that was used to build the footpaths; one panel at a time. There are more stories than any one pioneer can tell.

When the Brookfield pioneers start telling stories, they always describe how small the school was back then. And they are always astonished at how large the school has become. They say things like, "Back then, we never imagined that the school could grow to what it is now."

Keep that in mind as I tell you that in the Christian Bible there is an ancient section where God sends a message to one of Israel's kings. God's message is: *"Do not despise the day of small beginnings."* Back in 1986, our school began with nine students in a scout hall; they were small, small beginnings.

One warm day in 2016 I was strolling past that same scout hall on Henry Street. I walked around the bend where Henry Street becomes Smith Street and I got chatting with an oldie who lives in the units. Her good memory impressed me because she began telling me that back in the eighties a Christian school had started over there. She was pointing to the scout hall. This sunny day was some 30 years after that small beginning; a small beginning that she still remembered. It started then with nine students. At the time when she was talking with me in 2016, we had more than 600 students. Now, in 2023, we have more than 1,000 students. That rather small beginning has proven to have been a rather big foundation.

That was then, but this year has held another small beginning.

Even as I write this report for the College Yearbook, I am sitting in the office of our new Toolern Vale campus. The countryside backdrop is like another world. We are only minutes from Melton but surrounded by splendid scenery. Our Toolern Vale teachers are teaching and our Toolern Vale learners are learning, and this campus seems to us like the prettiest place on earth!

Our school is now; 'One Vision, Two Locations', and that is what we are. We have two campuses and both campuses fulfill the same wonderful vision. They bring the same lovely atmosphere that Melton has been built on since 1986.

We can't know what the future will hold, but we can know that in our school of miracle stories, days of small beginnings turn out to be days of big foundations. Our prayer and our vision is that the small beginning at Toolern Vale becomes another big foundation for great growth and God's good work in the lives of children.

ENROLMENT RETENTION

For schools, keeping students enrolled through to the end of Year Twelve has traditionally been considered an indicator of belonging and trust. That view is being questioned these days because it is understood that while tertiary studies are great for some people, other pathways suit certain students.

At MCC we never hesitate to encourage students who explore worthwhile alternatives to school, such as apprenticeships and/or meaningful employment. There is great strength in the VCE and VCE-VM programs, so we encourage the right students to complete one or other of these formal, senior secondary courses. Simultaneously, our view is that it is beneficial for other students to leave school, but only when they do this to take up offers of apprenticeships or other employment that may arise during the school year. Thus, the approach of MCC is not to discourage students as is age-appropriate, to take up opportunities when it can be seen that leaving school will benefit them long-term.

Of the 44 students who commenced MCC Year Twelve in 2023, 40 had been enrolled in MCC Year Nine in 2020. Thus, 4 students had joined the cohort. Of the 44 students who commenced MCC Year Twelve in 2023, all 44 completed Year Twelve by the end of that school year. MCC is satisfied that these 2023 retention results are indicative of good choices by students and their families.

SENIOR SECONDARY OUTCOMES

Melton Christian College offers both Victorian senior secondary certificates: Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major (VCE-VM). 100% of our 2023 Year 12 students completed their certificates. The VCE class achieved a median study score of 27.

POST-SCHOOL DESTINATIONS

We are proud that an appropriate proportion of our graduates from the 2023 cohort decided to pursue apprenticeships and other work immediately after graduating from school.

We are pleased to see students seeking placements in tertiary study, or confidently entering the workforce according to their God-given gifts. Our objective is that our graduates identify their calling and make meaningful contributions to their society throughout their lives

PARENT, STUDENT AND TEACHER SATISFACTION

A strength of Melton Christian College is the community's commitment to communicating proactively.

Parents are urged to stay in communication with College staff. Engagement, suggestions and feedback are welcomed between all segments of the College community. Students and their parents are in regular, schooling-related communication by email with school staff.

There are formal structures for communication such as Student Senate, Staff Meetings, Leadership Team meetings and College Council. In addition, the Board of Directors holds monthly meetings and the Annual General Meeting. These formal structures facilitate communication, and directly and indirectly maintain high satisfaction levels through responding effectively.

Melton Christian College participates in community surveys of parents, students, staff, alumni and other aspects of a school community. These surveys collect data for the explicit purpose of measuring school performance. The data is used directly to inform improvements to the overall work of the College and specifically learning programs and administrative systems.

Teaching Staff

STAFF ATTENDANCE

The average staff attendance for 2023 was 96%. This figure excludes planned absences for professional development, maternity, and long service leave.

WORKFORCE COMPOSITION

Melton Christian College staff members come from a wide variety of backgrounds. No staff member identifies as having an Indigenous background. Our teaching staff is composed of 70% female and 30% male staff members. The percentage of our teaching staff who work full time is 68% with a further 32% part time. Of the seventy-nine teaching staff, 54% have more than ten years of teaching experience.

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

All Melton Christian College teachers are accredited by The Victorian Institute of Teaching. All teachers have at the minimum, four-year tertiary qualifications including Bachelor degrees. In addition, eleven teachers have Master's degrees, fifty-one have Bachelor degrees, and seventeen have Diplomas, this is because quite a lot of our staff team have multiple qualifications.

EDUCATION LEADERS COMBINED YEARS OF EXPERIENCE

The principal and the six senior leaders have a combined total of approximately 150 years of school and education leadership experience.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

All staff are given ongoing opportunities to increase their understanding, update their strategies, implement new ideas, and stay abreast of curriculum changes.

Melton Christian College provides mainstream yet diverse programs from Prep through to Year 12, and seeks to make this excellent education affordable for families. Our programs equip students to show leadership in their community. We insist on high standards of self-management, independent-thinking, respect and selflessness. Our committed Christian staff strive to Value-adding programs included cultural experiences, sport, provide caring, focused learning-environments for students.

Our primary program emphasises the fundamentals of numeracy and literacy. From Prep through to Year 6 we implement the Structured Literacy model, which is evidence informed best practice. We follow a systematic synthetic phonics scope and sequence. Students learn the code of reading in a specific order supported by books that match the code they are learning. 'Synthetic' means building from the smallest parts. Instruction is explicit, meaning that children are first directly taught the letters and sounds, which are then embedded in the context of meaningful words and sentences.

The College campus has a stunning gymnasium, well-equipped science and design-tech facilities enabling woodwork, and hospitality, as well as a senior-school centre for year 10-12 academic classes. Performing and Visual Arts are programs that the children enjoy greatly. The entire College community loves our annual musicals. Japanese is taught as LOTE. Onsite instrumental music lessons are available, which makes it convenient for families. Our students represent our school in various inter-school sporting, academic and leadership events, and we have camps throughout upper primary and secondary

years. A range of VET (Vocational Education and Training) subjects are available through our partnerships with Western Edge VET Cluster of schools, however students do not need to go offsite for VET studies as the College offers onsite VET studies for our VCE and VCE-VM students. 
